

Mitsuru Toda, MS, PhD is an Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS) officer at the Mycotic Diseases Branch at the National Center for Emerging and Zoonotic Infectious Diseases (NCEZID) at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). She is an epidemiologist who has worked on topics such as invasive mold infections and cryptococcal meningitis. Before coming to CDC, she was based in Kenya for 7 years where she conducted operational research on disease surveillance, treatment, and systems strengthening. Most recently, she was the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Expert attached to the Ministry of Health in Kenya through Nagasaki University Institute of Tropical Medicine. In this capacity, she led the implementations of the pilot and national scale-up of a mobile technology based infectious disease reporting and outbreak detection tool. She received her PhD from Nagasaki University Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, her Masters in Science from Harvard University T.H. Chan School of Public Health, and her undergraduate degree from Manhattanville College in New York.
