Dr. Satoshi Shimada is the global infectious diseases research officer at the Infectious Disease Control Division of the Japan Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare where he works on infectious disease control, infection and public health risks at mass gatherings; and antimicrobial resistance (AMR).

Dr. Shimada spent more than 13 years as a physician before joining the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare. He is also a Japanese Pediatrics Society, board certified pediatrician; a Japanese Society of Allergology specialist for clinical allergies, and was sports doctor for the Japan Sports Association.

Dr. Shimada holds a MD degree from Mie University, a Ph.D. from the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences of Nagasaki University, which includes a certificate from the Program for Nurturing Global Leaders in Tropical and Emerging Communicable Diseases at Nagasaki University, and a Master of Tropical Medicine (MTM). He has over 5 years research experience with Biosafety level 3 viruses and specializes in arboviruses such as Dengue virus, Japanese encephalitis virus, and tick-borne viruses.
